This project allows students to complete authentic reading about a person of interest. Students were able to 'taste test' a number of books before choosing their person. Students created a poster that highlighted key character traits that made their person so important to our world. To wrap up the project, students participated in a 'living museum' day, where they came dressed up as their person and completed a short presentation for their class.

#### **Reminders for Parents**

Sometimes our church parking lot can become a very busy place especially with the staggered starts and end times. Here are some pointers to help it work more effectively:
