



#### ABSL's Month to Remember

Langley, BC (October 5, 2021) – The Arboretum and Botanical Society of Langley ("ABSL") invites the public to participate in a *Month to Remember* from October 12 to November 11, 2021. Les Clay, President of the ABSL said: "2021 has a number of milestones that we thought it would be fitting to recognize. It's been 10 years since the start of the troop withdrawal from Afghanistan, 10 years since the first tree was planted in the *Langley Youth for the Fallen: A Walk to Remember*, 70 years since the *Battle of Gaepyong*, and it's the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the *Legion's* poppy program." He went on to say: "In conjunction with this *Month to Remember*, we are also doing a fundraiser for the ABSL as we would like to create a Korean style garden around the *Battle of Gaepyong* stone at the Derek Doubleday Arboretum ("DDA")."

As part of the *Month to Remember*, the ABSL is encouraging people to visit the DDA and stroll the 1km *Walk to Remember* loop as they reflect on Canada's involvement and lives lost in all of Canada's military actions, not just the Afghanistan, Korean, and two World Wars. A brochure can be printed out from our website (abslangley.ca) that highlights some of the sites at the DDA to enjoy while walking, and which also has a walkathon chart that can be filled out to keep track of the number of kilometres walked during the *Month to Remember*.

Contributions to help fund the creation of the Korean War Memorial Garden can be made on our website (abslangley.ca) where more information is available on the ABSL.

The *Month to Remember* will conclude on November 11<sup>th</sup>, when we will be holding a special celebration at 2 PM at the *Walk to Remember* commemorative structure at the DDA. We invite everyone to join us at that time. Special mementos will be given for those who bring in their walkathon charts.

The Arboretum and Botanical Society of Langley is a group of dedicated volunteers who assist the Township of Langley with the design, development, and maintenance of the Derek Doubleday Arboretum site as a horticulture centre for the enjoyment and education of visitors.

# Fraser Health COVID-19 School Update – Immunization for 12-17 year olds

Health Canada has approved the use of the Pfizer vaccine for youth aged 12 to 17. British Columbia is expanding the COVID-19 Immunization Plan to include this age group.

Youth are excited to protect themselves and their families.

Children aged 12 to 17 can register to get vaccinated now by going to <a href="www.gov.bc.ca/getvaccinated">www.gov.bc.ca/getvaccinated</a>, calling 1-833-838-2323 or in person at any Service B.C. centre. Once child(ren) are registered in the provincial system they will be contacted at a later date via the method they indicated (either email or text) to book their vaccine appointment.

Household and group vaccination options are also available to make it easy for households to be immunized at the same time. Multiple young people in a household can attend one booked appointment and be vaccinated together. Young people accompanying adults to the adult's new vaccine appointment can register on site and do not need to be registered or booked in advance. Just let clinic staff know you have arrived.

Ensure all family members bring identification and ideally, their personal health card if they have one.

In the coming days, schools will receive an information package to be shared with families with key information such as how to prepare for and what to expect during your child's vaccine appointment.
