Our Who Is/Was books were the primary source of information students used to write a biography on their person. After doing research this culminated into both visual and oral presentations. All of the students gathered in the gym to present their influential figure to parents and students.

Entrepreneurial Fair - Our grade 5s were excited to share PowerPlay Young Entrepreneurs with the LFES community. They were very busy expanding their entrepreneurial mindset by preparing individual projects. Students built a business around crafting and selling a product for our in-house Fair. They were very excited to interact with customers as they put their business plans into action selling one-of-akind, handcrafted products. Products generally ranged from \$2 to \$20. Giving back back is a key part of connecting LFES with our community so a portion of the profits will be donated to a local charity of choice.

Thanks to the MANY staff who were involved with these two major events. The kids were so proud of their work and excited to present.


