#### Here is a message from our grade 5 team of teachers:

Since December the grade 5 students have been learning what it takes to be an entrepreneur and develop a business. Each student has been creating a business plan which includes their goals for their business, their product description and business operations. They have learned the concepts of price/cost/profit, marketing, and conducted market research. All of this has been in preparation for our Entrepreneur Show. On March 12<sup>th</sup> from 10:30am – 2pm we will have our gym set up with 87 booths where students will be selling their products. After students have paid back the loans for their startup costs they will donate 10% of their profits to a charity of their choice. We hope that you will be able to join us on March 12<sup>th</sup>. Be sure to bring cash as our young entrepreneurs are not able to process credit/debit cards or Bitcoin?

Today we had a lockdown drill to practice emergency procedures. These are scheduled two times during a school year. Teachers prepare their students for these drills and debrief with them afterwards. It's an important part of our school safety plan.
